

## VINTAGE KNITS

# A Cosy Scarf

From "Weldon's Encyclopedia " (published c. 1920)

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Project #16 from "[My Year of Weldon's](#)"



A lacy scarf or stole in two pretty lace patterns

The original pattern calls "4 oz. of Fine Shetland Wool" on No. 8 Needles (US #6)

The scarf is knit in 2 sections and grafted in the center.

Yarn: I used "Monterey Lace" from [Tactile Fiber Arts Studio](#), a 50/50 Merino and Silk lace weight yarn, colorway "Dew". A skein is 3.5 oz/1090 yards. I used approx. 2 oz total for the scarf (about 600 yards)

Needles: US #3/3.25 mm needles

Abbreviations:

K: knit

P: purl

YO: yarn over

K2tog: knit 2 stitches together

Project Notes:

There are two lace patterns (Chart 1 and Chart 2); Chart 1 shows ONLY the right side rows and doesn't include the border stitches:

For Chart 1:

Every row has a garter stitch border on each side:

All odd (right side) rows are worked thus:

K2, repeat chart across row to last 2 stitches, k2.

all even (wrong side) rows are worked thus:

K2, p to last 2 stitches, k2.

For Chart 2:

The 2 border stitches on each edge ARE included in the chart, and wrong side rows are included in the chart. The lace repeats are marked with a red box.

Instructions:

Cast on 118 stitches.

Work Rows 1-104 following Chart 1 (you will knit Rows 1-34 of the chart once, and Rows 3-34 twice for the lace border).

Row 99: K.

Row 101: K2, \*yo, k2tog; repeat from \* to last 2 stitches; k2.

Row 103: K12, \*k2tog, k21; repeat from \* 3 times, k2tog, k12 (113 stitches)

Work Chart 2, repeating Rows 105-120 until piece measures 26" (or half the desired total length of scarf) from cast-on edge. Place all stitches on

piece of waste yarn (they will be grafted to the live stitches of the second half of the scarf)

Knit Second Half of Scarf following the instructions above. Graft the halves together (center back neck) using Kitchener Stitch.

Finishing: Weave in ends, block gently.

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
